Criminal Justice Day Goes Off with a "Bang"

The Class of 2013's year started with a "bang" on Criminal Justice Day held at the county jail on October 18th. Sheriff Chris Nocco greeted the class by immediately involving them in a interactive exercise exposing them to the controlled chaos surrounding a major law enforcement emergency. Following that the class engaged in the usual panel discussions, walking jail tour, and interaction with Pasco's law enforcement officer brass. The class was then entertained by a live demonstration by the unified SWAT/TAC team.

During the afternoon session, the class adjourned outside where the events were started with an explanation by SWAT Commander, Chief James Steffens (NPRPD) of the job responsibilities of the SWAT team. Unbeknownst to the class, the group was infiltrated by two members of the SWAT team dressed in civilian clothes. Suddenly the perpetrator grabbed the female imposter, dragging her kicking and screaming toward a car. The perpetrator screamed, "get back or I'll kill her" as he began firing rounds from a pistol into the ground. The class was shocked by this sudden action!

Almost immediately the SWAT Bear, a large armored vehicle flew around the corner from one direction while an unmarked police car emerged from the other, surrounding the perpetrator who had just managed to get his hostage into a waiting car. The SWAT team responded to the crisis by deploying a "flash bang" grenade as it advanced on the scene. Even though the perpetrator fired multiple shots, the SWAT team was able to subdue and apprehend this violent make-believe criminal. Needless to say, the damsel in distress was released safely and the day ended with all going home safely; except for the class which was still trying to wear off the adrenaline from the momentary excitement.

The class then broke up into groups and had a chance to tour many of the Sheriff's specialty units, including the agricultural unit, the Missing & Abducted Children's Unit, SWAT, aviation, and tour the K-9 facility built by the class of 2011. K-9 finished the incredible day with a wonderful demonstration of their capabilities, led by Sergeant Brosnan. As the effects of the "flash bang" wore off, the class shared their common experiences of the day between themselves and the hosts. Overall, the consensus seemed to be that the day had been jam-packed with valuable experiences and information, and that everyone was leaving the jail with a renewed appreciation for the challenges faced daily by our "thin blue line."
