Explosions Rock Class of 2016

Criminal Justice Day was rocked by explosions, startling the Class of 2016! The day started at the crack of dawn outside the Land O' Lakes Jail with an adrenaline pumping SWAT and Aviation demonstration put on by the Pasco Sheriff's Office. As a domestic abuser grabbed a hostage at gunpoint, and took aim at an approaching deputy, smoke grenades filled the air distracting the would be hostage-taker. Flash-bangs further incapacitated the suspect as the SWAT team moved in with the Sheriff's helicopter swooping in at low altitude to be sure the scene was secured.

After touring the K-9 kennel, putting on SWAT equipment, seeing the helicopters up close and personal, and clearing an armed suspect out of a building, the K-9 unit put on an incredible display of the performance capabilities of its dogs.

During lunch the recently acquired body cameras were displayed with actual video footage from different situations. Some of the class members were given an opportunity to use the new "Shoot/Don't Shoot" computer generated program, while their classmates looked on.

After lunch the Child Protective Investigation unit gave graphic examples of the child abuse situations they face on a daily basis, followed by a presentation from Captain James Mallo about the School Resource Officer program. Then, the class worked together to handle a "crisis" situation on how to allocate law enforcement assets while still handling the routine law enforcement calls that never stop.

More explosions and gunshots rang out during the jail tour as the class experienced a mock mini-riot demonstrating how nonlethal weapons are used along with "stun" grenades in order to get control of the unruly group.

The day concluded with an outstanding demonstration by the forensics unit, showing how fingerprints are collected and different pieces of equipment are used to collect evidence. A few people were "grossed out" by some of the actual crime scene photos, but it was all part of the experience of learning how crimes are solved in the real world.

The day was made even better by the continuous presence of Sheriff Nocco and his entire command staff. Their commitment to making this day a success was obvious to the class and the entire group of law enforcement officers who participated. Leadership Pasco wants to thank the Sheriff and his entire staff and organization for their continued support of the organization.
